

Explanation and Examples of Non-Violent Crime Types

Select	Type of Incident	Brief Description	Examples
Theft	Theft of property (includes theft from yards, packages left on porches, money taken from tip jars, or vouchers taken from casino patrons)	The wrongful taking of personal property, but does not include firearms or vehicles.	 Stolen bicycle Wire theft Unlawful removal of metal from private recycling bins Stolen personal property of any type (excluding firearms or vehicles) Does NOT include lost property
	Theft of Services	Receipt of services with the failure of recipient to pay for those services.	 Failure to pay cab fare "Dine-and-dash" Sneaking into a theater without purchasing a ticket
	Theft from <i>exterior</i> of Motor Vehicle	Stealing wheels, tires, hood ornaments, or pieces of a vehicle.	 Stolen rims Stolen hood ornament Siphoned gas from the gas tank Does <u>NOT</u> include stolen license plates.
Vehicle Prowl	Theft from <i>interior</i> of Motor Vehicle/Vehicle Prowling	Unlawfully entering a vehicle and taking of property from the vehicle, or the vehicle interior shows signs of being searched.	 Passenger window is smashed and stereo is missing Glove box opened and contents removed Vehicle door lock was broken and purse is gone
Fraud	Taking of Property If you have video evidence, or you have a bill, invoice, email, etc., please call the non-emergency reporting number	Intentional use of deceit, a trick or some dishonest means to deprive another of his/her/its money, property or a legal right.	 Unexplained charges / withdrawals on credit/bank statement Advance Fee schemes - You pay upfront and receive little or nothing in return Being sold products that turn out to be "fake" Does NOT include impersonating a Police Officer
	Identity Theft If you have the fraudulent application form, please call the non-emergency reporting number	Deliberate use of someone else's identity that involves fraud or deception, typically for economic gain.	Unauthorized use of your personal information to apply for credit, welfare, tax refund, etc. for others' gain

Select	Type of Incident	Brief Description	Examples
Vandalism	Destruction of Property/ Malicious Mischief	Causing physical damage to another person's property.	Smashed window"Egging"Destruction of mailboxesTire slashing
	Graffiti Vandalism	Writing, painting, drawing or marking any property with paint, ink, markers, or other substance which marks property.	 "Tagging" Spray paintings, drawing, or written words on signs, walls, businesses, fences, buses, trains, homes, or other property
Lost	Lost Property	Missing or misplaced property. Property with no readily identifiable owner.	 Lost cell phone Earring left on a bus Keys dropped while on a walk Does <u>NOT</u> include firearms or vehicles
